How the LoTs can be established?

The Libraries of Things are establishments where items such as tools, household utensils, cookbooks, board games, or toys can be borrowed rather than purchased for their own sake. In Lithuania there are no such libraries or they are still at an early stage of development.



Libraries of Things

Steps towards establishing a LoTs:

Research and Planning: conduct research on the concept of Libraries of Things to understand their purpose, benefits, and operation. Identify potential target locations in Lithuania where a LoTs could be established. Consider factors such as population density, community interest, and available space.

Launch and Promotion: organize a grand opening event to introduce the Library of Things to the community.

Community Engagement: connect with local community organizations, neighborhood associations, and individuals who may be interested in supporting or utilizing a Library of Things.

Ongoing Operations: seek opportunities for collaboration with local organizations, schools, or businesses. Regularly update and expand the inventory based on community needs and interests.

Steps towards establishing a LoTs:

Formation of a Core Team: assemble a dedicated team of volunteers or professionals who are passionate about the concept of LoTs. Assign roles and responsibilities within the team to ensure effective management and coordination.

Secure Funding and Resources: explore potential funding sources, such as grants, sponsorships, or partnerships with local businesses or government agencies.

Location and Infrastructure: find a suitable physical space to house the LoT.

Inventory and Cataloging: decide what items you would like to lend. This can include tools, household appliances, sporting equipment, and other useful items. Develop a cataloging system to track items, their availability, and lending periods. Consider implementing an online platform or software for easier management.

Policies and Procedures: establish lending policies, membership criteria, and guidelines for borrowing and returning items.

About general legal considerations:

Business Registration: determine the legal structure of the library, such as whether it will operate as a nonprofit organization, a community group, or a for-profit entity. Register the library accordingly with the appropriate government authorities.

Safety and Compliance: ensure that the items available for borrowing comply with safety regulations and standards.

Liability and Insurance: understand the potential liability risks associated with lending out items

Data Protection and Privacy: develop policies and procedures for the handling of personal information of library members.
